UNITED STATES OF AMERICA PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of New York:

The petition of DOROTHY SCHUSSLER, hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 545 W 147 St, New York City, N. Y.

Second. My occupation is nurse (Give number and street)

Third. I was born on the 13 day of May anno Domini 1902 at Thimach Austria

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Rotterdam on or about the 25 day of Sept anno Domini 1920, and arrived in the United States, at the port of NY on the 8 day of Oct

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 4 day of June anno Domini 1923

under name of Dora Schussler (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given)

at NY in the Supreme Court of NY County

Sixth. I am not married. My (wife's/husband's) name is (she/he) was born on the day of anno Domini 1923

at and now resides at (Give number, street, city or town, and State)

I have children, and the name, date, and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to REPUBLIC OF AUSTRIA & (OR) REPUBLIC OF POLAND, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 6 day of Oct anno Domini 1923, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 6 day of Oct anno Domini 1920, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the Court of at on the day of anno Domini 1, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavits and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
