I, Patrick Joseph Manning, hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

My place of residence is 37 Goldsmith St., Boston J P, Massachusetts.

My occupation is 847 Refriggerman.

I was born on the 16th day of May, anno Domini 1884, at Poscannon, Ireland.

I emigrated to the United States from Queenstown, Ireland on or about the 20th day of April 1906 and arrived in the United States, at the port of Boston, Mass, on the 27th day of April 1906, on the vessel Saxonia.

I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 27th day of January, anno Domini 1903 at Boston, Mass, in the District Court of the United States.

I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and to the George V King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India and to any other power, prince, or person, at any time I am a subject, and it is my intention to remain in the United States.

I am able to speak the English language.

I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 27th day of April, anno Domini 1906, and in the State of Massachusetts, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, from the 27th day of April, anno Domini 1906, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of filing this petition.

I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court.
