In the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Eastern District of New York:
The petition of JACOB WALTZER hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 908 Sutter Ave. Brooklyn (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

Second. My occupation is Furrier

Third. I was born on the 12 day of August 1873, at Michnicia, Austria

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Rotterdam on or about the 5 day of May 1907, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York on the 16 day of May 1907, on the vessel Potsdam (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 5 day of February 1906 at Brooklyn, in the District Court of U.S.E.D.N.Y.

Sixth. I am married. My (wife's / husband's) name is Mary; [she / he] was born on the 17 day of June 1878 at Russia and now resides at Unknown (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

I have 7 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to REPUBLIC OF AUSTRIA and (or) REPUBLIC OF POLAND of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 16 day of May 1907, anno Domini 1907, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 16 day of May 1907, anno Domini 1907, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the X Court of U.S.E.D.N.Y. at Brooklyn on the 16 day of May 1907, anno Domini 1907, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
